To collect your VCE books for 2012. You have 3 options.

- 1) Order through Landmark, using the booklist, then pick-up your order from Collingwood College.

BOOKLISTS FOR 2012 – HOW THE SYSTEM WORKS:

There are Five Easy Steps to follow:

1. **Fill out** your Booklist 2012 Order Form.
2. **Cut off** the bottom section of the Booklist 2012 Order Form and keep this form as it is a record of your order, payment due and order collection date.
3. **Return Booklist** to the front office by the due date on the top of the booklist.
4. **Pay on collection day or pre-pay by:** Cash, EFTPOS, Credit card (Mastercard, Visa).
5. **Collect books** from the school on the date indicated on the "COLLECTING YOUR PARCEL NOTICE" on the bottom of the booklist.

Collecting your booklist order:

Students are encouraged to submit a booklist before the closing date, so that they can collect their order from the school on the date indicated on the "COLLECTING YOUR PARCEL" notice that's on the front of your booklist. Collingwood College student must collect their order on Thursday, 2nd February 2012. Times are detailed on the booklist.

These orders can be picked up only from Collingwood College Library on this day.

Orders (other than Pre-paid) not collected on the selling day – as detailed on the **COLLECTING YOUR PARCEL** notice – **will be returned to the new Landmark store at Hawthorn** where they will be available for collection until Saturday, 4th February, 2012.
